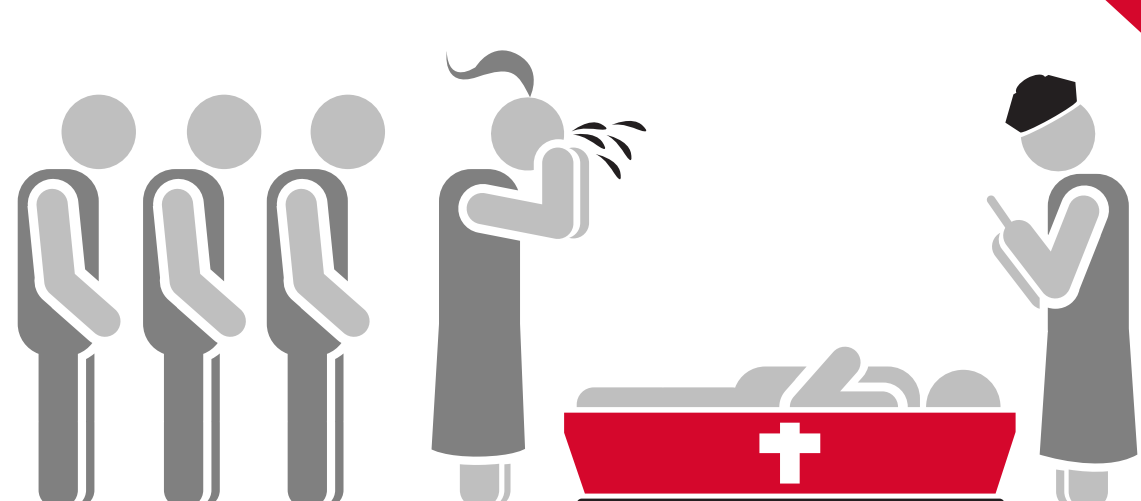

937 WORKERS IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY WERE KILLED ON THE JOB

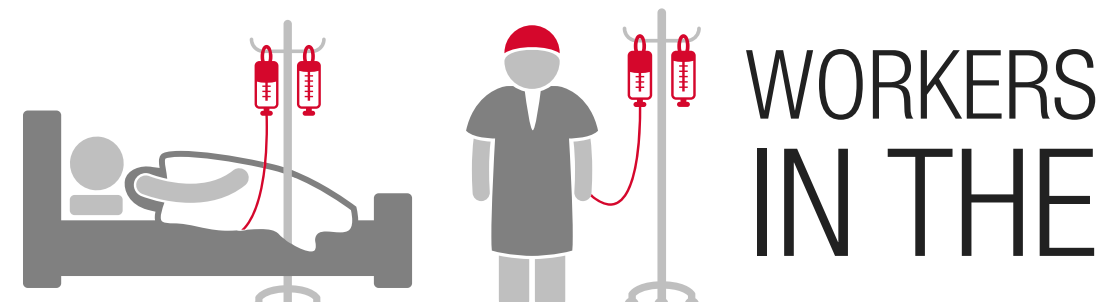


HIGHEST TOTAL SINCE **975** WORKERS DIED IN 2008

AN ESTIMATED **204,700** WORKERS IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY WERE INJURED ON THE JOB



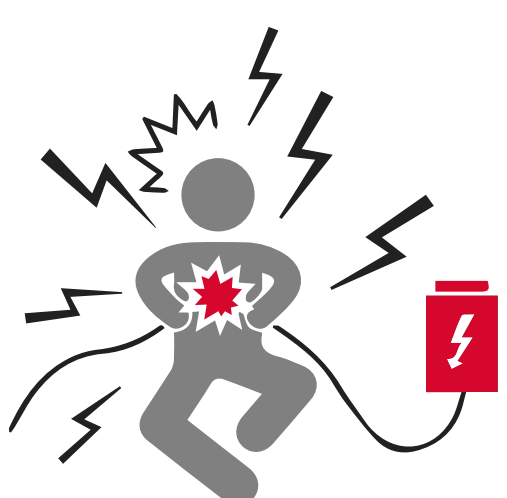
THE "FATAL FOUR" CAUSES OF WORKER DEATHS IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY IN 2015



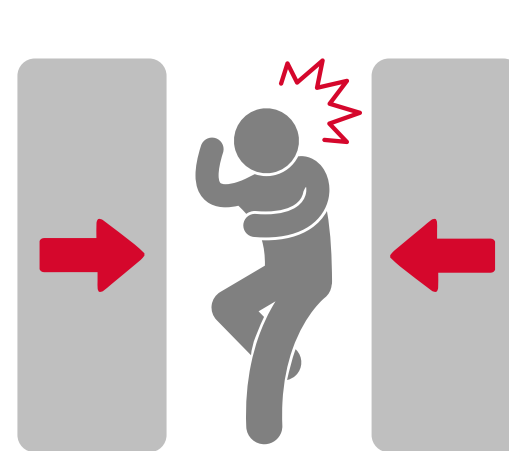

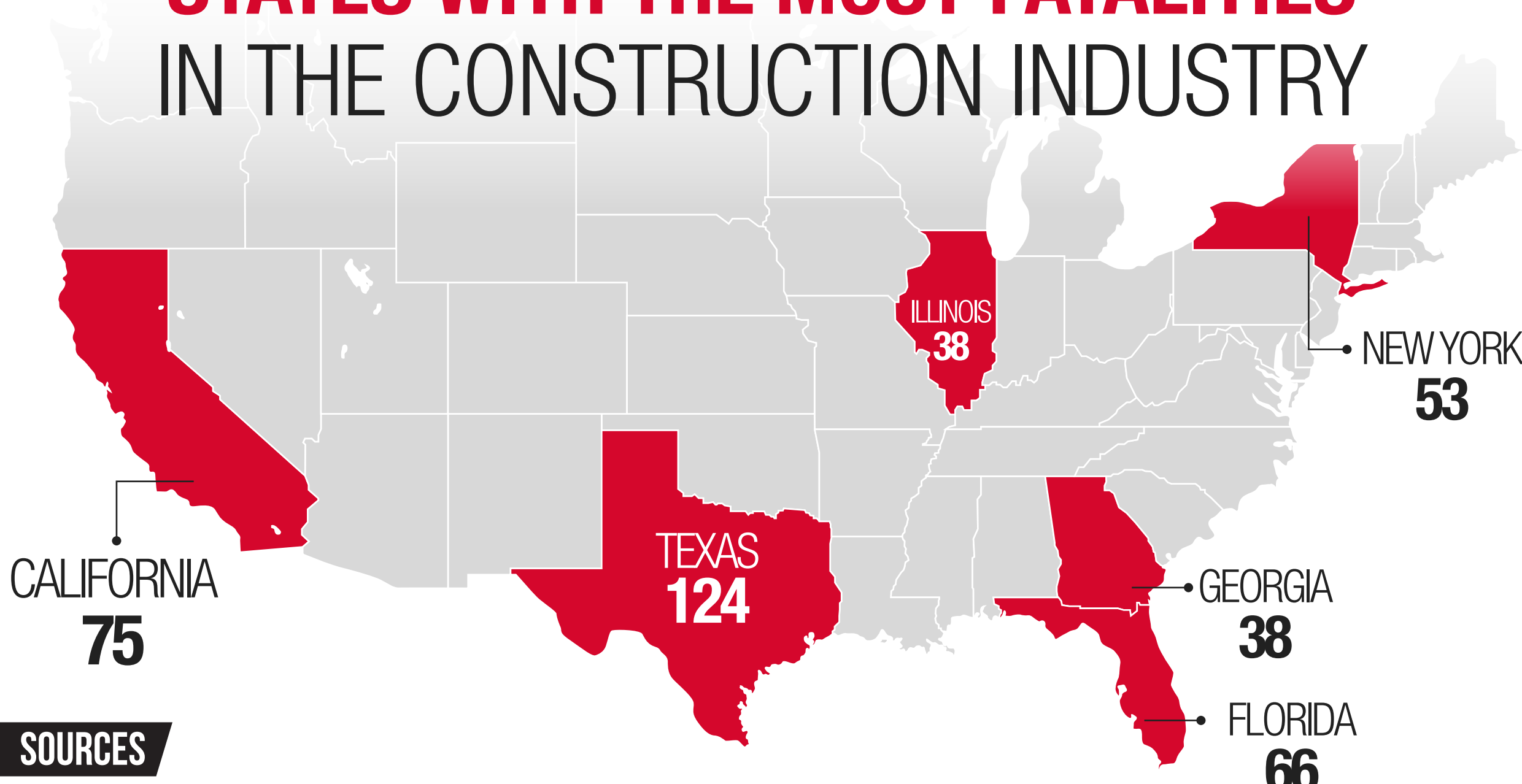
